 Total Volunteer hours = 57

RESTORING SHROPSHIRE'S VERGES PROJECT: Lyth bank

Following a presentation by Restoring Shropshire's Verges Project hosted by Neil Bates on 26th July 2023, Lyth Bank residents group identified two verges with the potential for restoration to wild flower verges.

Small working party was established and on 6th August volunteers scarified both areas and spread the Yellow Rattle seed and green hay from Pulverbatch which had been cut and bagged by volunteers.

Further work direct planting of wild flower plants (Oxeye daisies, Agrimony) in August 2023 and the growing on of plant plugs from seed to plant out next spring is planned
