Speaker Biographies



IAN NELLINS

Ian Nellins is Deputy Leader of Shropshire Council and Portfolio Holder for Climate Change, The Environment and Transport. Originally from Northern Ireland, he has lived in Shropshire since moving here with the Royal Irish Regiment in 2007. Since 2017 he has been a member of Market Drayton Town Council and the Chairman of the Royal British Legion (Market Drayton Branch). He became a Shropshire Councillor in May 2021 and was appointed to Cabinet shortly afterwards. His role includes Renewable Energy, EV Charging, Waste and Recycling, Floods, Public Transport and Active Travel. He is also the Council's Armed Forces Champion.



BARONESS BENNETT

Natalie Bennett (or Baroness Bennett of Manor Castle for really formal occasions), became the second Green member of the House of Lords four years ago. Leader of the Party from 2012-2016, she is also a vice president of the Local Government Association and the National Association of Local Government. Her professional life was largely spent as a journalist, finishing as editor of the Guardian Weekly. Her first degree was in agricultural science and she can get very geeky about soils, and fungi. Her first book, Change Everything: How We Can Rethink, Repair and Rebuild Societies, will be out in 2024.



ANDREW MALIPHANT

Andrew is a qualified parish clerk and regeneration manager who has been Environmental and Sustainability Advisor for SLCC since 2022. He is currently NALC's representative on the Government's Local Net Zero Forum. He was parish clerk at Longhope, Gloucestershire for eight years following three years as a parish councillor. Since 2023, Andrew has been chairman of The Place-Based Initiative Ltd, a new venture which has taken over the Great Collaboration website with a view to expanding its coverage of climate and nature recovery actions for town and parish councils working with their communities.



ALLAN WILSON

Since retirement from the Police Force, Alan has been actively involved in his concern for the environment. In 2017 he created a hedgehog preservation organisation. He became a parish councillor 2017 in Edgmond and became Chair in 2019. He was vice-chair of the Shropshire Association of Local Councils, holding the portfolio responsibility for climate change matters. In this role he has presented to councils extensively on their responsibilities under the Climate Change Act 2008. Allan co-founded Save Our Shropshire CIO (SOS) in July 2021, a charity dedicated to increasing people's understanding of Climate Change.


PETER CARTY
